2018 Farm Safety & Equipment Operation for Youth ages 12 & Older

Tractor and Machinery Certification is mandated by Federal legislation for any youth 14-15 years old working on a farm not owned or operated by the youth's parents or legal guardians and who are operating tractors over 20 PTO horsepower and/or certain farm equipment. In Wisconsin, any farm youth under the age of 16 are prohibited from operating agricultural machinery on public roads unless they have completed a Tractor and Machinery Certification Course. A law signed by the Governor in 1998 sets a lower age limit at youth 12 years of age to become certified in tractor and machinery operation.

Interested in becoming a 4-H Shooting Sports Leader?

4-H Shooting Sports projects are successful when adults volunteer to



work with youth and when youth are given the opportunity to develop safe shooting skills and a better understanding of wildlife ecology.



To serve as a 4-H Shooting Sports Leader, volunteers must be enrolled in 4-H, complete their county's Youth Protection process, be at least 21 years old and successfully complete at least one state-level 4-H Shooting Sports Certification Workshop.



Certifications Workshops are designed to teach adults how to conduct safe, supervised, shooting experiences for 4-H members enrolled in the project. Adults who are looking for an opportunity to mentor youth and be a positive role model in safely handling archery equipment or

firearms are encouraged to enroll in these certification workshops. If an adult leader is not certified, he or she cannot provide hands on or safety instruction without a certified leader being present.

A Wisconsin 4-H Shooting Sports Leader may be certified in archery, coordinator, muzzleloader, pistol, rifle and shotgun disciplines. Leaders may only teach in the discipline in which they are certified. An adult leader cannot provide hands-on or safety instruction without a certified leader supervising the range.

4-H Leaders' Board Treasurer Position

Every two years, the 4-H Leaders' Association accepts applications for the treasurer position. The general purpose of the position is to maintain, prepare and submit financial records for the Waupaca County 4-H Leaders' Association. The financial oversight of the committees and clubs is foundational to the chartering of our 4-H organization as a non-profit. The treasurer, as a 4-H leader, would be a voting association member, but not a voting board member. If you are interested in this position call the UW-Extension Office for a copy of the more detailed position description and an application. Applications are due to the office March 1, 2018.

VOLUNTEER LEADER NEWS

What is Expected of 4-H Project Leaders?

- First, make sure you're a certified 4-H leader!
- Get started now. Member enthusiasm for a project is highest at the time of enrollment. Find out who is enrolled in the project and set up your meeting now.
- At one of the first meetings of the year, help members set their goals for the project. Be sure members bring their 4-H member's record sheet with them to the meeting.
- Help members keep a record of what they did or made in the project for the year.
- Review progress toward the year's goals at your final meeting of the year.
- Try to organize and conduct at least three to six project meetings per year. Remember project tours or smaller work sessions can be offered to members in addition to group meetings.
- Involve youth leaders in meaningful ways. They are capable of helping in planning and teaching—not just being the helper or the clean up crew!
- Set an example in being prepared, organized, and flexible in working with youth.
- Seek out additional resources for project meetings.
- Keep your club's General Leader informed about meetings and other announcements.
- Call the UW-Extension Office if you have any questions.

With the switch to 4-H Online, club managers have the capability to print club reports/member information for their club. If you need any reports run for your club or a specific project area the Extension Office will gladly print them by request. Please look these reports over as soon as you receive them and get back to Annette with discrepancies. It's much easier to fix now than when fair entries are due!

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA)

Starting in 2018, Wisconsin will replace the MAQA (Meat Animal Quality Assurance) program with the YQCA (Youth for the Quality Care of Animals), which is an online program with modules geared to age groups. Modules include animal welfare, food safety and life skill development, and it is estimated that youth will spend roundly 60 minutes completing the modules each year. There are also in person class opportunities. Wisconsin State Fair and other national exhibitions will require certification in YQCA for participation in 2018 events. This is for livestock, dairy, goat, poultry and rabbit youth exhibitors. Additional information will be forthcoming.
