COUNTY FAIR NEWS

Waupaca County Fair, August 22-26, 2018

Project meetings are underway and we are looking forward to this year's county fair that is right around the corner!

Go to the Waupaca County Fair website for an online version of the fair book: http:// waupacacountyfair.org/fair-book/

You should be receiving your fair entry forms from your general leaders this month. Remember fair entry forms are due in the UWEX office by Tuesday, July 10 (they are due earlier to your club leader/advisor).

Remember that it is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY to return your fair entry form <u>to your Club Leader</u> by the club designated date. Your Club Leader will check it over for correctness, and then turn your fair entry in to the UW-Extension Office by July 10 with your exhibitor entry fee.

After the 10th, entries may be *deleted*, but not added. Please double check your entries to make sure you have entered the classes in which you really want to exhibit and that they correspond to the projects you are enrolled in.

The Fair Board has set the Junior Fair exhibitor entry fee at \$4.00 for up to 50 entries, \$6.00 for 50-100 entries, and \$10.00 if entering over 100 entries.

Cloverbud Fair Entries and Deadline

Cloverbuds may enter up to five items in the County Fair from Dept 35. Cloverbud exhibits will be "judged" face-to-face by a volunteer on Wednesday, August 22, from 12:00 p.m.—7:00 p.m. in the Youth Building. Cloverbuds will receive a ribbon for each exhibit entered in the County Fair. Cloverbuds complete the same fair entry as other members and are listed in the fair book under department J-35 and entries are due on July 10.

Question: *How do I sign up to bring things to the fair?*

Answer: Signing up to exhibit at the Waupaca County Fair is different than enrolling in 4-H (which you did last fall). The junior fair is an event that you can participate in because you are enrolled in 4-H. To exhibit in the fair you must submit a completed and signed entry form to the Extension office by July 10 with fair entry fee. Entry forms should have been handed out by your club organizational leader. They are also available on the County Fair website http:// waupacacountyfair.org/fair-book/

A completed entry form includes a Department, Class, Lot number, written description, appropriate signatures, and entry fees.

- ► The Department is the subject or project area. For example Department J-1 is Dairy, Department J-17 is Exploring.
- ► Within each Department there are classes. Sometimes they are based on the exhibitors' grade, sometimes they are based on the years of experience in that project and sometimes they are based on the exhibit.
- ▶ Within each class there are Lot numbers. The lot number is a specific entry within a class. You can have only one project for each lot number listed under a division and class. This includes the "any other item" lots. If there are two exact entries listed on your Entry Form, you will only receive one Fair Entry Tag. There are no exceptions to this rule. There may also be a limit on the number of items you can enter in a certain class.
- ► All of the rules for exhibiting are in the Fair book. Please read all the rules carefully and don't hesitate to contact the Extension office if you have questions as you fill it out.


ATTENTION ALL ANIMAL EXHIBITORS

CONTINUED IN 2018 – See the back of the Waupaca County Fair premium book for the animal check in form. The Fair Board is requiring one copy of this form



per exhibitor, per species, per truck load of animals you bring to the County Fair. Feel free to make copies of the form. On this form is a line asking for the Premise's ID. The Wisconsin Premises Registration Act, effective November 1, 2005, requires anyone who keeps, houses, or co-mingles livestock to register their premises. Dogs, cats, and rabbits are not required to be registered for a Premise ID#. The Fair Board is asking exhibitors to record the Premise ID number on forms. Admission to the Fair



to 7:00 p.m. at the Youth Building and on ENTRY DAY. Unclaimed passes and wristbands, after 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday, will be returned to the Fair Secretary.

Please remember, registered, certified leaders are being asked to pay \$10.00 of their leader pass. The Leaders' Association will be paying half per pass. In order to

get the tickets at the \$10.00 cost, it needs to be indicated on the order form each General Leader received. The order forms are due with fair entries on July 10. If your name is not indicated as purchasing a leader pass in advance, there will not be a leader pass at the fair for you. Leaders who have not completed all leader training requirements are NOT eligible for the reduced fair pass.

Record Book Pages

You should have received record book pages from your club organizational leader. For members, record books are a valuable part of the 4-H experience. They are intended to help you develop lifelong skills such as:

- \Rightarrow Setting goals
- \Rightarrow Planning and organizing
- \Rightarrow Communicating in writing



 \Rightarrow Evaluating effort and progress

Once completed, members experience personal satisfaction from completing a worthwhile task. You also have a valuable record of accomplishments that can be used when applying for awards, scholarships, college or a job!

Have You Started Your Record Book Yet?

Don't forget to be working on your 4-H Record Books during the summer while completing your projects. Record books and award forms are due to the UW-Extension Office on September 18, 2018. Just a reminder that record books need to be turned in to your club leader prior to this, so each club will have their own earlier deadline. In the August / September Forecast will be a more specific listing of all of the awards members could earn from their record books and who can nominate them. Some of the awards include achievement awards, project awards, record book seals, Teens in Action, Teen Leadership and Scholarships.

If you have questions or would like some help starting on your record book contact leaders in your club or the UW-Extension Office at (715) 258-6230.

Here's some tips and information on how to make this end of the year task a little easier:

What should I include in my record book? Refer to the

yellow 4-H Project and Record Book Guideline Sheet. On the front is a list of what to include and what not to include as well as some specific tips on how to put your book together.

When is my record book due? Each club sets their own date prior to turning books into the county in mid September.

<u>If I got a grand champion at the fair will I</u> <u>automatically receive a project award</u>? Project awards are based on the information included in your record book. Awards given at the fair are based on one item completed as part of your 4-H project. In reviewing your record book, leaders evaluate the goals you set and if you achieved them, what you learned and made, how you shared what you learned and any recognitions that you received. You need to tell the complete story in your record book to be considered for a project award. At the county level leaders from another county review your book and are not as familiar with your accomplishments as the leaders in your own club so make sure you let them know everything you have done!

Reminder to Project Leaders Have you Planned your project meetings vet?



School is over so now would be an excellent time for 4-H Project Leaders to plan meetings for the 4-H members in your project group (if you haven't already done so)! Some suggestions to help project leaders plan effective meetings are as follows:

- 1. Get a list of all names and phone numbers of Club members who are enrolled in your project. Contact your Club General Leader or the Extension Office to obtain this information
- 2. Consult with some parents and/or members to see when the most effective meeting dates and times will be, then work the best times for everyone into your own calendar to the extent possible. A good time to ask parents and members about meeting times would be right before or right after your club's regular monthly meeting.
- 3. Work with youth leaders in your project areas.
- 4. Decide what you want to help your project members learn and/or make. The 4-H project literature and/or leader guides can provide ideas, or contact Penny at the Extension Office for suggestions. Write down a listing of the main points or ideas to be learned. This list doesn't need to be long...its far better to teach two or three main points well than to try and cover a lot of material lightly!
- 5. For each main point or idea, think of a hands-on activity or demonstration you will use to get the point across. Write down exactly what you plan to do, step-by-step, and work through each step at your project meeting. Are your planned activities age-appropriate? Will you need a helper? If so, ask a youth leader, parent or older member in the project to assist you.
- 6. Write down a list of materials/supplies/equipment you will need for each activity or demonstration, or for each item you intend to have the kids make.
- 7. Estimate the time you will need for each meeting, and how many meetings you will need to complete your planned activities. Make a short list of meeting dates, times, locations, etc. and what to bring to each project meeting. Distribute this list

to member families ahead of time.

- 8. At the end of each project meeting, briefly review what was covered. Ask your project members 3-5 questions and have them answer verbally to reinforce what was learned.
- 9. Remind project members to fill out the appropriate record book pages or better yet, make filling out those pages a part of your meeting!

Celebrate the Arts

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation is excited to announce a brand new event to support and promote the 4-H ARTS called "CELEBRATE THE ARTS." The inaugural event will be held October 2018 and will include an Arts Auction and Reception to support and promote the 4-H Arts Program, and to network with arts-programming supporters and prospects. Proceeds from the event will be invested in the Talen Endowment for 4-H Arts Programming and in the arts program for the next 4-H calendar year.

To make this event successful, Wisconsin 4-H Foundation is sponsoring an Arts Contest with cash prizes totaling \$700. To be eligible for the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Arts Contest, youth must be a 4-H member in good standing for the 2017-2018 Program Year. Entrants do not need to be enrolled in any specific project to participate. All art must fit into or use the theme "Head, Heart, Hands, Health." The contest will be divided into four categories: Drawing Using any Medium, Painting (Watercolor, Acrylic or Oil), Paper or Fiber Art, Photography

First and a second place will be awarded in each category with a Best of Show Award given to one entry chosen by the judging committee. Category winners will receive a \$100 cash award and reserve in each category will receive a \$50 cash award. The Best of Show Entry will receive an additional \$100 cash award.

Entries will be accepted on Monday, June 25, 2018 from 11 to 2 pm, at Sellery Hall on the University of Wisconsin-Madison Campus (during State 4-H and Youth Conference.)

The first and second place items in each category will become the property of the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation and will not be returned. All rights to the winning pieces of art become the property of the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation and artists relinquish all rights to use, reproduce or exhibit their entry. Artists may be asked to sign their work or to sign reproductions of their work. The top two entries in each category will be sold at "Celebrate the Arts."

The "Celebrate the Arts" Event will be held at the Brittingham House on Saturday, October 13 from 5-7 p.m. Artists of the winning pieces will be invited to attend the event to present their artwork at the auction.

State 4-H Policies and Insurance Reminder

As summer begins and clubs are planning a variety of events, please keep in mind the Wisconsin 4-H Policies, updated in April 2016, which state:

- Lifeguards are required when youth are swimming or participating in water-related activities, including canoeing, kayaking and boating. This includes at camp, club program, or hotel.
- Personal flotation devices (pfd's) are required for boating, canoeing, and kayaking.
- Pointing any type of firearm including air guns, paintball guns, laser guns or laser sighting devices at any person or any humanoid or tombstone target is inappropriate and dangerous. This includes both shooting sports programs and any type of 4-H activity.
- Remember to look into special activity insurance for club events and outings.
