Greg Blonde Retirement

Waupaca County Agriculture Agent UW-Madison Division of Extension

In January, Greg Blonde notified UW-Madison Extension administration and the Waupaca County Agriculture & Extension Education Committee that he will retire this summer (last day Friday, June 5) after nearly thirty-six years as UW-Madison Extension Agriculture Agent for Waupaca County. Greg says, "It's not easy leaving something you love, especially when it's the only thing you know. But who we are is more than what we do, and like someone once told me, all good things must come to an end".

Greg says he often asks, "Where did three and a half decades go! I can still remember my first day (August 22, 1984) like it was yesterday. It also happened to be the first day of the Waupaca County Fair that year, which was a great opportunity to meet a lot of wonderful people I would be working with for years to come". In 1994, Greg helped establish the Extension Master Gardener program in Waupaca County. Since then, over 200 Waupaca County residents have completed general MG training and supported several local volunteer projects. He credits current and past local MG Board members with outstanding leadership and support for helping to grow and maintain the local MG Association, especially in a rural county like Waupaca. In addition to current Extension office colleagues (especially Dana), Greg credits previous co-workers like Steve Hemshrot, Bernie

Mayek and Tom Wilson for their collaboration and support.
Given significant and growing financial implications from the ongoing pandemic for both UW and county budgets, as well as uncertainty over how long the financial implications will last, all Extension hiring has been suspended. But when the time comes, Greg is confident farmers, Ag professionals and local Master Gardeners will welcome and support the next Waupaca County

I leave you with this picture of one of my better looking flower beds. It gives me the sense of what promise the future holds . . .






Crocuses are my favorite first to bloom in the spring flower!
