Approved Outdoor Gardening Activities:

An approval form must be completed, submitted, and approved prior to engaging in gardening activities.

- Many host organizations (botanical gardens, county and municipal parks, not for profits, health care facilities, etc.) provide the oversight of these gardening activities. Confer with those organizations on additional restrictions that may be in place before resuming activities. Keep in mind bathrooms and tool access may be off limits. This information will be critical for filling out the form.
- Once the form is completed, please work with your county staff to forward the form to the Area Extension Director for approval. If you do not have a staff person available in your county, please send to <u>mike.maddox@wisc.edu</u> to initiate the approval process.
