MEETING IDEAS FOR 4-H CLUBS

We know there are challenges for clubs to be able to meet in person inside during the colder months and there continue to be rising numbers of COVID cases. The current rules state that pods of 10 or less may meet inside (with masks) but each pod must be separated in a different room. This leaves many asking. "How am I supposed to keep our club members engaged?" Here are some ideas:

- Focus on FUN. Have your youth leaders and/or adult project leaders take a turn teaching various skills or workshops via small in-person groups (10 or less)** or via Zoom. Plan club project boxes.
- You may feel it could be hard to lead and/or get youth motivated to attend a Zoom business club meeting. Therefore, keep it simple! Focus on the fun ideas and limit the business meetings to 20 minutes or less, or maybe even just every-other month.
- Have a club challenge could be a family outdoor scavenger hunt or a community service challenge for club families.
- Plan an outdoor winter event: Snowshoeing, cross country skiing? Remember that as long as pods of 10 or less can distance and each pod remain at least 20 ft apart



outside, this can be submitted for review**

- Encourage your youth to take advantage of state-offered workshops and zooms.
- Model a positive attitude. If youth see their leaders speaking positively, they will more likely respond positively!
- Watch your email for blast emails about upcoming opportunities!
- · Reach out to Penny Tank with small in-person programming ideas or to submit a request for approval form for any inperson events or meetings. The Waupaca County Moving FOURward Committee is also planning to

meet again soon and would love to have additional ideas to consider and discuss.

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation has kicked off a contest that challenges all 4-H members to explore their creativity!

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Celebrates the Arts Art Contest is open to any current Wisconsin 4-H member, with cash prizes totaling nearly \$1,000. The contest will be held virtually, with photos of all entries submitted electronically. Entries are being accepted now through January 1.

The contest is broken into eight categories:

- 1. Drawing Using Any Medium
- 2. Painting (acrylic, watercolor or oil)
- 3. Pottery, Ceramics or Clay
- 4. Photography
- 5. Paper
- 6. Fabric, Yarn or Fiber



- 7. Wood
- 8. Any Other Media (ex: digital, metalcraft, jewelry, leatherwork, wax, eggshells, taxidermy, etc.)

A winner will be chosen in each category with a Best of Show award given to the top entry as chosen by the judging committee. Category winners will be purchased by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation for \$100, with the Best of Show entry receiving an additional \$150. Winners will be notified by email, a complete winner's list, as well as photos of the winning entries, will be on the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation website.

<u>Community Service - 4-H Clubs and Bell</u> Ringing for the Salvation Army

[In the state] There have been some questions about whether 4-H groups selecting bell ringing for the Salvation Army [as a service project] would be in conflict with our policy which states we are focused on education and not advancing a particular religion.

In this case, the Salvation Army states as its goal to meet human needs without discrimination. 4-H members choosing to participate in bell-ringing as a community service option would be allowable within our current policy.

These are challenging questions to navigate, as they involve many factors to consider, including member choice vs. requirements, clear roles in fundraising for other organizations, and non-discrimination policies of partners. This is also an opportunity to emphasize service-learning and the alignment of club activities with our shared goals.

- Youth Voice and Leadership: Are youth leaders involved in identifying issues they want to address and planning the response?
- Supportive Relationships: Do service-learning opportunities create opportunities for building ongoing relationships with other youth and adults in the community as well as creating opportunities for bonding within the group?
- Post-Secondary Pathways: How are youth learning about career and lifelong service opportunities?
- Expanding Access: How do service opportunities create opportunities for others to participate in 4-H? How do we remove barriers to all youth benefitting from service-learning opportunities?

If the club is choosing to do Bell Ringing for the Salvation Army this year there are some COVID safety tips that need to be followed.

- A program guidance check form needs to be completed (club general leaders received a sample form to complete)
- · Participants should do the bell ringing outside of the store/location
- Participants need to wear masks
- Participants should remain at least 6 feet away from the collection kettle in order to keep socially distanced from customers visiting the store or location.
- Families should take time slots as a family unit.
