READY FOR RE-ENROLLMENT!**

Go to <http://wi.4honline.com> to access the new system. Your family login and password will be the same as you used last year. If your password does not work, you can click on the Reset Password link on the login page and you will be emailed a new one.

The system will look totally different from what we had in the past, but you can use the family enrollment guide at [https://fyi.extension.wisc.edu/4h-ext/files/2020/09/4HOnline.v2.Family.Enrollment.Guide .pdf](https://fyi.extension.wisc.edu/4h-ext/files/2020/09/4HOnline.v2.Family.Enrollment.Guide.pdf) for help during the enrollment process. **Also, please read the brief descriptions on each screen while re-enrolling, these are very helpful to explain that step in the enrollment process.**

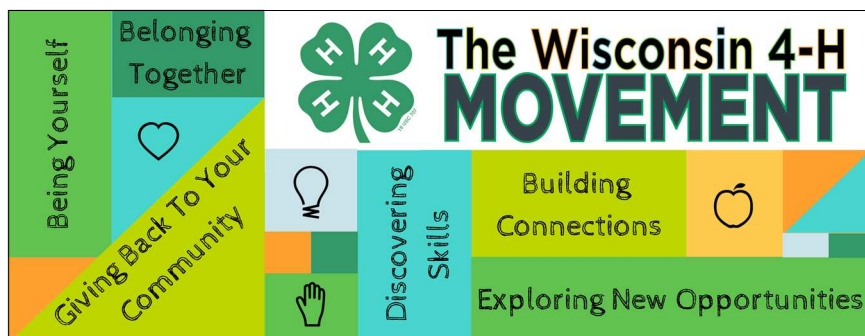

Who:

What do we do?:

- It is expected that each Ambassador will participate in at least two opportunities each year (in addition to ambassador meetings)
- Ambassador meetings – attendance expected
- Supporting county 4-H programs through a variety of assistance (planning, organizing, promoting, hosting, emceeing, teaching, etc.). Examples:
 - Promotion / 4-H programs during County Fair
 - Elementary School open house, radio program, or other 4-H promotion
 - Ambassador Fundraiser
 - Community Service with Ambassador group
 - 4-H Club visits (in addition to your own club)
 - Teach at Super Saturday, Officer Training, Day Camp, New Family Events, Record Book Clinic, or Fair Orientation, etc.
 - Assist at a county event like Music and Drama, Foods Judging, Achievement Night
 - Participate in older youth/family events planned or sponsored by Ambassadors (bowling, ice skating, etc.)
 - Help with fair preparation (for example, youth building set up, painting, etc.)

4-H EDUCATIONAL EXPERIENCES

Applications for Educational Experiences will no longer be due November 1. We recently received an update from the Wisconsin 4-H Office and National 4-H, that educational experiences like Citizenship Washington Focus, Leadership Washington Focus, Space Camp, American Spirit and others will not be held in person in 2021. National 4-H is working on preparing virtual experiences and more information will be shared, along with scholarship application information, when the new details are known. Depending on the COVID 19 pandemic, the Wisconsin 4-H office may look at creating some experiences closer to home (Midwest) and we will share that also when any specifics are planned.

WISCONSIN 4-H FOUNDATION CELEBRATES THE ARTS

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation has kicked off a contest that challenges all 4-H members to explore their creativity!

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Celebrates the Arts Art Contest is open to any current Wisconsin 4-H member, with cash prizes totaling nearly \$1,000. The contest will be held virtually, with photos of all entries submitted electronically. Entries are being accepted now through November 1.

The contest is broken into eight categories:

1. Drawing Using Any Medium
2. Painting (acrylic, watercolor or oil)
3. Pottery, Ceramics or Clay
4. Photography
5. Paper

6. Fabric, Yarn or Fiber
7. Wood
8. Any Other Media (ex: digital, metalcraft, jewelry, leatherwork, wax, eggshells, taxidermy, etc.)

A winner will be chosen in each category with a Best of Show award given to the top entry as chosen by the judging committee. Category winners will be purchased by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation for \$100, with the Best of Show entry receiving an additional \$150. Winners will be notified by email by November 20, and a complete winner's list, as well as photos of the winning entries, will be on the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation website by December 15, 2020.

The 2020 Wisconsin 4-H Virtual Livestock Judging Contest will occur on Sunday, October 18th, 2:30-6:00pm.

Juniors (age 8-13) and Seniors (age 14-19) are invited to register as individuals to participate and display their livestock evaluation skills in this competitive educational experience. All youth are welcome to participate. 4-H membership not required.

Youth will judge classes and enter placings through www.LivestockJudging.com. Seniors will present oral reasons via Zoom. Juniors and Seniors will also answer questions for a portion of the classes through [Livestockjudging.com](https://www.Livestockjudging.com).

With the cancellation of all national 4-H livestock judging contests in 2020 These will be stand-alone, non-qualifying state educational contests.
