
All 4-H leaders are encouraged to attend! Plan to attend, vote on issues and be informed, have fun!

Project Resources and Curriculum

4-H has lots of educational resources for 4-H'ers working on individual projects, as well as clubs working on group projects

and educational activities. Most items listed are curriculum books that are designed to give the 4-H'ers everything they need to learn about the project they have chosen. These books include a list of the materials needed, how much time it will take, how to do the activity, and then the questions to ask as part of the Experiential Learning Process. 4-H curriculum is built for sequential



activities, so project and life skills can be built upon, practiced, and eventually mastered over time. They are research based, hands on and FUN! The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will award more than \$15,000 in scholarships to outstanding
Wisconsin 4-H members and alumni pursuing highe education in 2020. To be considered for financial support, applications must be received by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation via email by Monday, March 15, 2021, 5:00 pm.

The Waupaca County Large Market Animal Scholarship was established to support and reward youth for their market livestock knowledge and participation, leadership skills, and involvement in the community. The Waupaca County Large Market Animal Committee has put \$2,500 toward scholarships. Scholarships will be utilized by recipients to further their education. Applicants must be Waupaca County Large Market Animal exhibitors and may apply for the scholarship the year they graduate from secondary education or the following year. Past recipients are not eligible to

compete for this scholarship. The completed application and one letter of recommendation from a non-family member must be submitted to Bobbie Jo Montgomery, Waupaca Learning Center 1515 Shoemaker Dr. Waupaca WI 54981 on or before March 15 of the current

<u>Small Market Animal</u>—Youth interested in the opportunity to sell a small market animal (poultry, rabbit, goat) should

- ★ contact the Extension Office to register by March 1. Email penny.tank@wisc.edu or call 715-258-6230 ext 9 and leave a detailed message with your name, address, club, and phone number
- * A packet of materials will then be mailed to you.
- * A virtual zoom meeting will be held on Monday, March 15 to review the materials. The youth or a representative for them is expected to participate in the zoom call.
- ★ If you are not able to be on the zoom call, you are required to email penny.tank@wisc.edu and a recording of the zoom will be emailed to you. There will be a few questions you need to answer showing you watched the recording and this is due by March 22.
- ★ March 22 is the final day to qualify for the small market animal sale opportunity.

Large Market Animal

Youth interested in the opportunity to sell a large market animal (beef, sheep, swine) should plan to attend 1 of 2 tag registration meetings. There will be two tag registration meetings offered as drive thru events at the Fairgrounds and this is also where you will get the project rules, etc.

- April 17th 6:30 to 7:30pm at Waupaca County Fairgrounds
