WAUPACA COUNTY 2021 SMALL MARKET ANIMAL SALE RULES

INTRODUCTION: The sale is the responsibility of the leaders and the youth from the rabbit, poultry, and goat projects and the market committee to be coordinated with the market animal sale.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. To teach members to work in breeding, selecting, feeding, and showing their poultry, rabbits and/or goats.
- 2. To provide Junior Fair Small Animal Exhibitors an opportunity to sell top quality poultry, rabbits and/or goats at the Waupaca County Fair.
- 3. To provide incentive and encourage a stronger development of the animal projects.
- 4. To recognize members who do quality work in breeding, feeding, selecting and showing their market poultry, rabbits and/or goats.
- 5. Encourage SMA families, leaders and youth to work together on committees, programs and activities to make a successful market sale. Teamwork creates an atmosphere of leadership, understanding and appreciation.

MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS TO SELL:

- 1. Participants must be **enrolled in a youth organization recognized by the Waupaca County Fair** for each species they intend to enter in the Market Animal Activity.
- 2. EACH PARTICIPANT IS REQUIRED TO ABIDE BY THE INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS (IAFE) NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS. All exhibitors agree to this code during the online entry process.
- 3. Third graders may show an animal, but may not sell.
- 4. The sale is voluntary, but interested youth must follow the steps below for 2021 Complete this google form <a href="https://docs.google.com/forms/d/e/1FAIpQLSdHUsgqiFmH7D8YvXF-oqe7aknLPQ9bimGOIgJ0TWpA1OoBpA/viewform?vc=0&c=0&w=1&flr=0 by March 10. After you complete the google form linked above for small market:
 - *A packet of materials will then be mailed to you.
 - *A **virtual zoom meeting will be held on Monday, March 22 at 7:00 p.m.** to review the sale rules and materials. The youth or a representative for them is expected to participate in the zoom call. Zoom connection information will be included in the mailing and emailed to you after you register for small market. (please note this date was changed from March 15 due to a scheduling conflict)
 *If you are not able to be on the March 22 zoom call, you are required to email penny tank@wisc.edu
 - *If you are not able to be on the March 22 zoom call, you are required to email penny.tank@wisc.edu and a recording of the zoom will be emailed to you. There will be a few questions you need to answer showing you watched the recording and this is due by March 29.
 - *March 29 is the final day to qualify for the small market animal sale opportunity for this year.
- 5. Members must contact three potential buyers or more. Buyer contact slips for rabbits, poultry and/or goats will be handed out at the meetings. **WHO CAN BUY:** Anyone interested in encouraging youth. Anyone who enjoys and appreciates good-quality meat. Anyone who would gain beneficial advertising value.
- 6. Only members who completely fill out and contact three buyers will be allowed to participate in the Small Market Animal Sale. Buyer forms **MUST BE TURNED IN ON ENTRY DAY IN THE DROP BOX BY 8:00 PM.** Drop box (brown) is in Rabbit/Poultry barn on the check-in table.
- 7. Members must complete three (3) educational eligibility requirements prior to the Sale.

 Opportunities for educational requirements will be handed out at the mandatory meeting.

- a. Members with animals not eligible for market sale in any current year may carry over 2 educational points.
- b. Members who turned in point sheets last year (2020), can carry forward up to 2 educational points for 2021 since there was not a small market animal sale in 2020. Do not write last year points on this year's sheet.
- **8.** Specific service on one committee is NOT MANDATORY IN 2021 It is mandatory each family help with one committee or event sponsored by SMA committee. Must attend mandatory meeting and serve on one committee. If there is a sale in 2021, it is each family's responsibility to help with sale procedures and the sale.
- 9. Each member is required to sell 5 books of Waupaca County Market Animal raffle tickets (members in large and small market only need to sell 5 books) to be **turned in at the fair or before raffle drawing**. \$25 will be required payment for tickets not turned in.
 **** By attending the mandatory meeting and being involved in the Small Market Animal Project, does not guarantee you to sell your market rabbit, poultry and/or goat at the Market Animal Sale.

DAY OF SALE: August 27, 2021, 5:30 p.m. Hospitality Hour at 4:30 p.m.

- 1. Seller cannot sell in more than one County Junior Fair Small Market Animal Sale. (Except State Fair)
- 2. Seller or representative must be at the sale and is responsible to bring animal to sale arena and be ready for sale and return animal to barn after sale.
- 3. Help with sale setup, hospitality (bring a dish to pass as assigned), and **NEED TO HELP CLEAN UP THE SHOW ARENA AFTER THE SALE**.
- 4. PROPER SHOW ATTIRE AND SHOES SHOULD BE WORN IN SALE RING.

AFTER THE SALE:

- 1. All sold market animals have an option to be processed at a local processing facility (Inspected, processed, vacuum sealed, frozen and weighed) Buyer's will pay for processing.
- 2. Seller is responsible to make arrangements with the buyer to deliver purchased animal(s) in September.
- 3. Ten (10) percent of sales commission will be deducted for Small Market Committee expenses.
- 4. The seller must complete a thank-you card for the buyer. Small Market will have cards in the Rabbit/Poultry barn by Saturday for you to fill out and give to a committee chair person or co-chairperson prior to receiving their check. Once the thank you is received, the thank you will be mailed by the chair person. IF THE THANK YOU IS NOT GIVEN TO THE CHAIR OR CO-CHAIR BY SEPTEMBER 1, THE SELLER WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO SELL NEXT YEAR!
- 5. Seller recognition will take place at the start up or annual meeting in the fall.

Participation in the Large Market Animal Sale does not jeopardize eligibility in the Small Market Animal Sale.

ANIMALS MUST BE OWNED AND RAISED BY EXHIBITOR.

ANIMAL ELIGIBILITY: TOP FIVE (5) eligible animals to sell (includes champions) from each eligible lot. Participants are allowed to exhibit more than one species, but no more than one small animal can be sold in the sale. In the event there are not 5 eligible animals in a lot, lots may be substituted with eligible sellers/animals.

EXCEPTION: Participants who exhibit more than one Champion Animal, either grand or reserve will

be allowed to sell those Champion Animals, limit of 2 champions in sale per exhibitor. If any physical abnormalities, lack of condition or illness that may affect the quality of the animal, a Judge may deem an animal unable to sell.

Goats- A grand and reserve ribbon will be awarded provided there is a minimum of 6 goats shown in dairy market. A separate grand and reserve ribbon will be awarded provided there is a minimum of 6 goats shown in commercial market. **Rabbits**- only 1 grand and reserve will be awarded over all from the 3 lots as long as there are 6 or more entries shown. **Poultry** - only 1 grand and reserve will be awarded over all from the 5 lots as long as there are 6 or more entries shown.

CLASSES TO BE SOLD: Check current Fair Book for Department, Class & Lots

Check the current fair book for health rules and barn rules. Check with Extension Waupaca County for up to date information on regulations regarding poultry, rabbits and goats.

RABBITS: All judging of rabbits will follow the A.R.B.A. Standard of Perfection. A Standards book is available for viewing at the Extension Waupaca County Office. Information to order your own copy is also available.

- **1. Single fryer:** Not over 69 days old and not less than 3 1/2 pounds or over 5 1/2 pounds. Not entered in any other class.
- **2. Roaster rabbit:** Between 70 and 180 days old and over 5 1/2 pounds with the maximum weight of 9 pounds. Not entered in any other class.
- **3. Meat pen**: (one unit consists of three (3) rabbits). All rabbits must be the same breed, variety and color. Rabbits shall not be over 69 days old, not less than 3 1/2 pounds or over 5 ½ pounds, or entered in any other class.

POULTRY: All judging of poultry will follow the American Poultry Association's Standard of Perfection. A Standards book is available for viewing at the Extension Waupaca County Office. Information to order your own copy is also available. You can have either sex, but remember the judge looks for uniformity.

ALL HATCHED AFTER JANUARY 1 OF FAIR YEAR

- 1. **Roaster**: (2 birds, either sex, each weighing over 5 pounds, and not more than 8 pounds).
- 2. **Broiler**: (2 young birds, each weighing 3 to 5 pounds).
- 3. **Young duck**: (either sex, 5 pounds or over).
- 4. **Young goose**: (either sex, 7 pounds or over).
- 5. **Young turkey**: (either sex, over 15 weeks of age).

GOATS: Each exhibitor can show up to 3 animals max in market, they will be included in the 7 animals per goat project limit. Goats must be born after August 31 of previous fair year. Weight classes will be determined after weigh-in on entry day. Goats will be sold by unit, not weight.

CLASSES:

Dairy market:

- 1. Dairy Market Goat (if bringing only 1 dairy market goat)
- 2. Dairy Market Goat (if bringing 2 dairy market goats)

Commercial market:

- 1. Commercial Market Goat (if bringing only 1 commercial market goat)
- 2. Commercial Market Goat (if bringing 2 dairy commercial market goats)
- *Must be weighed at official Fair scale from 8:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.
- *All wethers MUST be castrated at least 45 days before entry day and healed from being castrated.
- *Mandatory dairy and commercial market goat minimum weight of 60 pounds.

If you do not follow the above rules, the Small Market Executive Committee will have a meeting to decide whether or not you will be able to sell the next year.
