Current Guidance for April/May

Thank you to everybody that has been working with Penny through the COVID guidance for meetings during the past year. Below is a snapshot of the updated guidance so you can plan April and May meetings or events. The guidance for June, July, and August will be released soon.

• Program Approval checklists are still needed for all in person events (club, county, projects, workshops, service activities, etc), along with contact logs after. Be sure you send program checklists to Penny at least 10 days-2 weeks before your event. The general updated COVID guidelines for Extension and 4-H programming for April and May are:

- Number of people who can be at events or programs is increasing
 - Indoors up to 30% of a room capacity with a maximum of 50 people allowed in a large room
 - Pods still needed, see below
 - 150 people allowed for outdoor programming
 - Pods still needed, see below
- Pod size increasing to 20

- ♦ Groups of 20 or fewer can meet together
- If you have 21 or more people you will need to break into groups/pods of no more than 20 per group
- Maximum length of indoor events increasing to 4 hours

Items that are not changing and will need to continue for April and May:

- Continued use of face coverings
- No eating indoors
- Physical distancing (6 ft between members outside household; 20 feet between pods)
- Hand sanitizing / disinfecting requirements
- When there is more restrictive local guidance we must follow that rather than our guidance.

For members, record books are a valuable part of the 4-H experience. They are intended to help you develop lifelong skills such as:

- Communicating in writing
- Evaluating effort and progress

Once completed, members experience personal satisfaction from completing a worthwhile task. You also have a valuable record of accomplishments that can be used when applying for awards, scholarships, college or a job! Remember to begin saving information for your record books throughout the year.

Similar to last year, **printed copies of record book pages will be given to those that want them**. We will not be printing and handing out record book pages to all members as in the past unless requested through your club leader or the extension office. General leaders will be receiving an email shortly asking who in their club may want printed pages, please let them know your interest. Get Involved in the Plarn Mats Service Learning Project

Did you know about one trillion single-use plastic bags are used every day in the U.S? That's according to EarthDay.org. And many in our community are experiencing homelessness. Wisconsin 4-H has created a service project to reuse plastic bags and to help the community. It's the 2nd Annual Wisconsin 4-H Service Learning Project for 2021.

Youth can take part in the Plarn Mats project. Plarn is plastic yarn, made by looping plastic bags. The plarn is then crocheted together to create a mat. The mat can be used to lie on or to help with warmth. Youth of all ages can participate in the project. Waupaca County Fairest of the Fair Applications Available

Applicants must be 18 years of age as of January 1, 2021. The selection process will include both an individual interview and group interview during the Fairest of the

Fair Competition, which is mandatory for all applicants.

The Waupaca County Fairest of the Fair serves as the official ambassador of the Waupaca County Fair, representing and promoting the Fair at local events throughout the year. The Waupaca County Fairest of the Fair also makes daily appearances during the week of the Fair.

The Fairest program provides an opportunity to applicants to grow in public speaking, etiquette, confidence, presentations, interviews and more.

Wisconsin Towns Association Scholarship

Each year, in partnership with Rural Mutual Insurance Company and Scott Construction, the Wisconsin Towns Association offers seven \$1,000 scholarships to students who are graduating from a Wisconsin public or private high school and will be attending a Wisconsin public or private college or university in the fall of that year. Applicants are required to write a 500-1000 word essay on a specific topic that relates to town government. Proof of enrollment in a Wisconsin private or public college is required. The scholarship essay topic for this year is: "What lessons can town governments take from the COVID-19 pandemic to improve their emergency management systems and prepare for and respond to future disasters?"

COUNTY FAIR

Entry day for the youth Jr Fair exhibitors will be on Wednesday, August 25th. More details regarding judging will be announced on the fair's website within the next couple of months. The Waupaca County Fair Board is planning to open the fair to the public starting on Wednesday, August 25th at 6:30 for the Farmer Tractor Pull in the grandstand. There will not be a carnival that night. Then the whole fair will open on Thursday.



Due to the cancelation of last year's fair, this is the second year of the two year fair book, which is posted on the fair website at waupacacountyfair.org. Entry information will be available in later May to sign up for fair project entries. Fair entry will be done through the online system again this year. Junior Fair entries are due no later than July 13, 2021.

Foods Revue (Foods project judging) for County Fair will take place on Saturday, July 24 (not the Saturday prior the fair as it was for many years).

4-H Projects vs. County Fair Exhibits

What's the difference between 4-H projects and fair exhibits? A **4-H "Project"** is an area of interest you want to learn more about (like a hobby). This is what you sign-up for during enrollment in 4-HOnline (i.e. horse, electricity, dogs, photography, etc.). A project is intended to help you explore, learn, and practice skills in your areas of interest. Youth must choose their projects at the time of enrollment so they have plenty of time to learn about or practice with their project area before the fair.

A **County Fair "Exhibit"** is what you actually take to the fair – like the cabbage you grew, the animal you trained, or the rocket you built while exploring and learning about your projects. There may be some things you do while exploring your project area that you do not take to the fair as exhibits and that is ok. Youth sign up to exhibit at the County Fair during June/early July based on the exhibits and rules listed in the Waupaca County Fair Premium book
