not limited to, paying bills, taking in payments, treasurer reports for each Board meeting, drafting annual budget, preparing paperwork for taxes, and more). The treasurer, as a 4-H leader, would be a voting association member, but not a voting board member. Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships are awarded to students based on demonstrated personal growth, development and leadership in 4-H, academic performance and future educational goals.

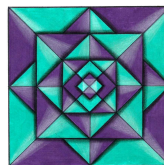
To be eligible for Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships, students must have been a Wisconsin 4-H member for at least one year; have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, and be enrolled or planning to enroll at a university, college or technical school during the 2022-2023 academic school year.

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation has kicked off a contest that challenges all 4-H members to explore their creativity!

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Celebrates the Arts Art Contest is open to any current Wisconsin 4-H member, with cash prizes totaling nearly \$1,000. The contest will be held virtually, with photos of all entries submitted electronically. Entries are being accepted now through December 31.

The contest is broken into eight categories:

1. Drawing Using Any Medium
2. Painting (acrylic, watercolor or oil)
3. Pottery, Ceramics or Clay
4. Photography
5. Paper
6. Fabric, Yarn or Fiber
7. Wood
8. Any Other Media (ex: digital, metalcraft, jewelry, leatherwork, wax, eggshells, taxidermy, etc.)



A winner will be chosen in each category with a Best of Show award given to the top entry as chosen by the judging committee. Category winners will be purchased by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation for \$100, with the Best of Show entry receiving an additional \$150. Winners will be notified by email, a complete winner's list, as well as photos of the winning entries, will be on the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation website.

EDUCATIONAL EXPERIENCES FOR YOUTH GRADES 10-12

State 4-H is excited to announce that two statewide opportunities have opened up applications/registration! Both the 2022 National 4-H Conference and the 2022 Citizenship Washington Focus programs will be in-person in 2022. Both of these programs are open to youth in 10-12th grades.

National 4-H Conference

National 4-H Conference is a working conference in which youth and adults—at the invitation of the Secretary of Agriculture—assist in the development of recommendations to help guide 4-H Youth Development Programs and other federal department activities nationally and in their communities. This event brings together youth, volunteer leaders, and state and county Extension staff members from across the United States, the U.S. Territories, and the Canadian Provinces. The Conference includes roundtable discussions and federal partner agency presentations and an opportunity for delegates to engage with their U.S. Senators and Representatives. At the same time, we want to ensure that the conference is a rich and meaningful experience for the youth and adult participants.

Citizenship Washington Focus, or CWF for short, is the premier week long 4-H citizenship and leadership experience.

CWF brings 4-H delegations from all over the country to stay in Washington D.C., our Nation's Capital! Participants learn about the roles of Senators and Representatives in the United States' government and how these parts work together to form an effective Congress. Additionally, youth get to see and experience government in action by meeting with their State's members of Congress and watching a House of Representatives meeting. Delegates also participate in various educational workshops.

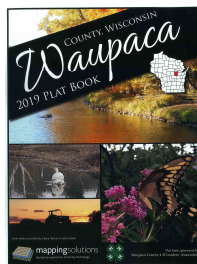

BECOMING A 4-H VOLUNTEER

Becoming a 4-H Volunteer

If adults are interested in becoming a project or activity leader for your club or county, call your general leader or Extension Office for enrollment information. There are numerous projects offered to members and it would be great to have more leaders to help throughout the year with project meetings and events.

Becoming a 4-H Volunteer includes four steps to ensure youth protection for 4-H members. These steps include:

- signing up as a volunteer on 4HOnline
- passing a background check
- doing an online module called the Mandated Reporter
- completing the Volunteer in Preparation face-to-face training (dates will be announced later this fall or spring). If you have completed some of these steps, but aren't sure where you are in the process, please contact the Waupaca County Extension Office.

All adults need to register through 4-H Online and if they are a new volunteer, a background check will be run by the state 4-H office prior to an individual completing the volunteer training.

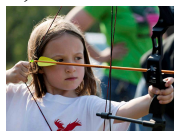

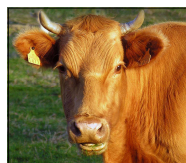
Large Market Animal Committee Meeting

Animal Sciences Education Series Announced for 2022

The Wisconsin Youth Livestock Program (WYLP) is excited to offer LIVE Virtual Zoom educational programs for the spring of 2022. Club / Group Charters—Thank You

Thank you very much to all of the group and club youth and adult leaders who completed the Annual Financial Reports and Charter Applications. They provide information that allows us to extend the right of using the 4-H name and emblem to clubs and groups in the county. Thank you all for helping in that process.

As we continue another 4-H year, I want to remind everyone of the financial guidelines.

- Regardless of the source, all 4-H funds are public funds
- Keep receipts and copies of any bills! You should only be paying for things when there are receipts and/or utilize payment vouchers as needed.
- Do not keep “petty cash” or “cash boxes” with money on hand. Run all money through an approved account. This gives you a trail of deposits and payments.
- Put all income and expenses into categories as you incur them

- or pay them. This will help in filling out the financial reports.
- Budgets help clubs and groups plan, if your club would like help creating a budget please contact the Extension office.
- Also, please remember to keep all financial records for 7 years, as this is the timeline for retaining financial records from the IRS.
- Club fundraisers should be conducted to reach a certain goal; there should be a plan and reason for raising a certain amount of money.

4-H Emblem Use

Many clubs make posters to promote 4-H, banners, order t-shirts for their club, and do other promotion efforts in each community. These are great opportunities for the program. There are guidelines for proper use of the name and emblem. The 4-H name and emblem belong to the 4-H Youth Development Program, under the authority of USDA and anyone wishing to use it must obtain permission.
