Online Reporting System (ORS) Updates

The ORS will be completely offline from January 1 to 9.

On J**anuary 10th**, Master Gardeners will get limited access to the ORS to accept the 2022 terms and conditions of the Wisconsin Extension Master Gardener Program. Due to significant updates to the program, you are required to accept Terms and Conditions before you start volunteering.

- Terms and conditions will be available to read in both Onboarding-lite and on the website in the new year.
- Please take the time to read. They will be similar to the volunteer agreements we used in the past.

January 10th to February 1st - The ORS will be unavailable to enter hours. The Program needs time to transition the ORS to a new format. It will be available to enter hours around Feb. 1st. You will be notified when it is available.

In the meantime, please keep track of your hours for January to be entered at a later date.

2022 Onboarding-Lite

It will be available the first week of January 2022 in Canvas. You will be notified when it is available.

Due to significant updates to the program, you are required to complete 2022 Onboarding-lite before you start volunteering. It will be a requirement of the terms and conditions in 2022. You can claim **5 hours of continuing education**. We estimate that it may take you less time than this.

Onboarding-lite is similar to the Onboarding Course except the fee, the exam and ORS account creation are removed from the course.

Updates to Master Gardener Program

Updates to Status Levels

In the <u>video update</u> we introduced changes to our status (participation) levels within the Extension Master Gardener Program. Here, you will find explanations to the new participation levels and hours requirements

Master Gardener Participation Levels for 2022

At a statewide level the policy defines:

- Different levels of participation in the Extension Master Gardener Program
- When you are removed from the program
- How you can return to the program

Participation Level: Certified

Criteria: You report BOTH a minimum of 24 hours of volunteer service and a minimum of 10 hours of continuing education into the ORS by the December 31 deadline.

You agree to terms and conditions.**

Notes:

- You are active in the program and contribute the minimum # of hours in both volunteer service and continuing education.
- You are Certified the following year.
- You are connected to program resources (i.e. Canvas, ORS, emails, etc.)
- You are eligible for awards and recognition (TBD)*

Participation Level: Active

Criteria: You report less than the minimum hours of volunteer service (24) or continuing education (10), and report at least 1 hour of volunteer service and 1 hour of continuing education into the ORS by the December 31 deadline. You agree to terms and conditions.**

Notes:

- You are Active in the program, contributing less than the minimum # of hours in both volunteer service (24) and continuing education (10), but reporting a minimum of 1 hour in each.
- You are uncertified for the following year.
- You are connected to program resources (i.e. Canvas, ORS, emails, etc.)
- You may not be eligible for some awards (TBD)*.

Participation Level: Inactive

Criteria: You report less than 1 hour in either volunteer service or continuing education into the ORS by the December 31 deadline. You agree to terms and conditions.**

Notes:

- You are Inactive for the following year.
- You are connected to program resources (i.e. Canvas, ORS, emails, etc.)
- You are ineligible for awards and recognition.

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Continued - Master Gardener Participation Levels for 2022

Participation Level: Deactivated

Criteria: You report two consecutive years of less than 1 hour in either volunteer service or continuing education into the ORS by the December 31 deadline.

Notes:

- Beginning of year 3, you are removed from the Extension Master Gardener Program.
 - + You are removed from the email list and your ORS & Canvas account is deactivated.
 - + You are no longer affiliated with the Wisconsin Extension Master Gardener Program and may not use the term "Wisconsin Extension Master Gardener."
 - + You may re-apply for admission according to the policy.

Participation Level: Honored

Criteria: You complete 10 years* OR 1000 hours of service to the Extension Master Gardener Program in Wisconsin as recorded into the ORS AND list significant accomplishments to the local or statewide program. This should include leadership, contributions to projects, or support to other volunteers and Extension staff. You agree to terms and conditions.**

Notes:

- You complete the application. (Applications will be accepted only from November 1 through December 31, with decisions awarded before March 31.)
- Criteria is subject to change in the future.
- You are connected to program resources (i.e. Canvas, ORS, emails, etc.)
- * Contingent on new awards and recognition system.
- ** Terms and conditions include the Code of Ethics. The Master Gardener Program reserves the right to update these as necessary.

To return to the Master Gardener Program:

Once Deactivated, you have up to 5 years since last being Active/Certified to return to the program (with the requirement of completing Onboarding-lite (no exam, no fee).

After 5 years of absence, you must re-enroll and complete Onboarding (take exam and pay fee).

You will return with a participation level of Inactive. The hours you report into the ORS by December 31 will determine your participation level for the following year.

Do I need to take Onboarding-lite again if I took it in 2021?

- Yes. Due to significant updates to the program and Onboarding, it will be a requirement of existing members to complete the 2022 Onboarding-lite course. A no-cost version will be available in the Canvas Classroom and will count towards continuing education for Master Gardeners who are currently in the program. You can claim **5 hours of continuing education**. We estimate that it may take you less time than this.
- You are required to complete 2022 Onboarding-lite before you start volunteering. It will be a requirement of the terms and conditions in 2022.



History of National Seed Swap Day

The National Seed Swap Day was first held in 2006 and on the last Saturday of January every year. The first official Gardener's Magazine seed exchange was held in Washington DC on January 26, 2006. Kathy Jentz, the magazine's editor and publisher, founded This Day. Growing in popularity, the Day has become a national day of celebration. Seeds are considered one of the first commodities to be valued and traded. National Seed Swap Day has been observed the last Saturday in January.

January 2022

Volunteer Newsletter



- 1. Avoid heavy traffic on your dormant lawn; dry grass is easily broken and damaged.
- 2. Remember to **prune your houseplants** regularly. Pinch back new growth to encourage bushier plants.
- 3. Group houseplants to increase humidity. Keep away from frosty windowsills.
- 4. **Brush off heavy snow** from your plants and trees. Remove any branches that have been damaged by ice or snow.
- 5. Don't forget winter birds! Put out water, seeds, and suet
- 6. Check your fruit trees for any evidence of rodents; use traps where necessary.
- 7. **If you use salt on your walkways or driveways**, spread it carefully to avoid damaging any of your plants. Sand or sawdust is also a good alternative to salt.
- 8. Check your garden equipment. Repair and sharpen tools. Service equipment.
- 9. Order seed catalogs early in the month. Research plants. Consider edible varieties that are drought-tolerant or disease-resistant.
- 10. Start ordering seeds. Do not wait until late in the winter, as varieties may sell out early.
- 11. Review or Start your Garden Journal. Plan for the 2022 Gardening Season.
