New enrollments after February 1

VOLUNTEER LEADER NEWS

Becoming a 4-H Volunteer

If adults are interested in becoming a project or activity leader for your club or county, call your general leader or Extension Office for enrollment information. There are numerous projects offered to members and it would be great to have more leaders to help throughout the year with project meetings and events.

Becoming a 4-H Volunteer includes four steps to ensure youth protection for 4-H members. These steps include:

- signing up as a volunteer on 4HOnline
- passing a background check
- doing an online module called the Mandated Reporter
- completing the Volunteer in Preparation (VIP) training.

All adults need to register through 4-H Online and if they are a new volunteer, a background check will be run by the state 4-H office prior to an individual completing the volunteer training. If you are a new leader and still in need of completing the VIP training, contact Penny at the Extension Office to get date options for the training.

For adults who volunteer with young people and care about young people. One way to show we care is to give help and support when someone is feeling down. That's what the Supporting Youth Mental Health for Volunteers Training—Supporting YMH, for short—is all about: knowing how to support youth when they're down, whether it's simply a bad day or it's more than that.

Supporting YMH has two parts:

- 1-hour online training
- 2-hour live training—offered virtually or in-person

Join the YMH Movement

A team of youth, volunteers, and staff developed this training. In 2022, it's available to you!

Volunteer Requirement (this training is valuable for any volunteers, see below for overnight experience requirements):

- 2021-2022 4-H year: Transition year; Ovemight youth experiences require at least two adults trained in supporting youth mental health.
- 2022-2023 4-H year: Overnight youth experiences require all volunteers serving as chaperones, or adult advisors, to be trained.
- Check out the website above for training opportunities (mainly virtual at this time)

Club and/or Project Printouts

With the switch to 4-H Online, club managers have the capability to print club reports/member information for their club. If you need any reports run for your club or a specific project area the Extension Office will gladly print them by request. Please look these reports over as soon as you receive them and get back to Annette with discrepancies. It's much easier to fix now than when fair entries are due!

What is Expected of 4-H Project Leaders?

- First, make sure you're a certified 4-H leader!
- Get started now. Member enthusiasm for a project is highest at the time of enrollment. Find out who is enrolled in the project and set up your meeting now.
- I'm a
- At one of the first meetings of the year, help members set their goals for the project. Be sure members bring their 4-H member's record sheet with them to the meeting.
- Help members keep a record of what they did or made in the project for the year.
- Review progress toward the year's goals at your final meeting of the year.
- Try to organize and conduct at least three project meetings per year. Remember project tours or smaller work sessions can be offered to members in addition to group meetings.
- Involve youth leaders in meaningful ways. They are capable of helping in planning and teaching—not just being the helper or the clean up crew!
- Set an example in being prepared, organized, and flexible in working with youth.

- Seek out additional resources for project meetings.
- Keep your club's General Leader informed about meetings and other announcements.

Project Resources and Curriculum

4-H has lots of educational resources for 4-H'ers working on individual projects, as well as clubs working on group projects and educational activities. Most items listed are curriculum books that are designed to give the 4-H'ers everything they need to learn about the project they have chosen. These books include a list of the materials needed, how much time it will take, how to do the activity, and then the questions to ask as part of the Experiential Learning Process. 4-H curriculum is built for sequential activities, so project and life skills can be built upon, practiced, and eventually mastered over time. The James W Crowley 4-H Dairy Leadership
Award program provides recognition to youth who have excelled in their dairy project. The award named in honor and memory of James W. Crowley, longtime Extension Dairy Specialist and strong supporter of dairy youth projects. A special engraved medallion will be presented to the outstanding 4-H dairy project member in each county for their accomplishments in 2021.
County Award winners are eligible to compete for 15 state-wide awards. State winners will receive plaques and the top three youth in the state competition will each receive \$1,000 awards.
Eligibility: 1)Must be currently enrolled in the 4-H Dairy Project

and have at least two previous years of membership in it. 2)Must be in 10th-13th grades as of January 1. 3)Should have an outstanding record of involvement and accomplishments in the 4-H Dairy Project. Contact Penny at the Extension office for an application which is due by March 15. A county winner will then be selected and forwarded to the state.

<u>4-H Livestock and Skill-a-thon Contest and the State 4-H Meats</u> Judging Contest

Mark your calendars for the upcoming 4-H Livestock and Skill-athon Contest and the State 4-H Meats Judging Contest! What are the contests? These are three different contests all about livestock where you can use your knowledge about the animal species (beef, sheep, swine, meat goat) and the industry.

Livestock Quiz Bowl, Saturday, April 9, UW-Madison Campus: Livestock Bowl is a quiz competition where all the questions are about beef, sheep, swine, and meat goat topics. Students use a buzzer to answer the questions (similar to the game show Jeopardy). **Livestock Skill-a-thon**, Saturday, April 9, UW-Madison Campus: Everything you know about raising your animal adds up to so much knowledge of the species and the industry. The Skill-a-thon contest will challenge you to share that information through a written quiz and learning stations.

Meats Judging Contest, Saturday, April 30th, UW-Madison Campus: Have you been to your local meat market or grocery store lately and think you could choose the best cut of meat out of the case? Have you ever



watched a live animal contest and thought you could choose what animals would provide the best meat products? This is your opportunity to put those skills to work.

Who can participate? Any current 4-H members ages 8-18. Please note, there are age divisions for each of those contests. Even if your county has not participated in the past, round-up some 4-H friends and take advantage of this fun opportunity to show your knowledge of the animal species and industry.

2022 Targhee Sheep Association Starter Flock

The U.S. Targhee Sheep Association (USTSA) will again, for the 14th straight year, be offering a free registered Targhee Starter flock to a deserving youth at the 2022 USTSA National Show and Sale, held July 18-20, 2022, in Big Timber, MT. The winner must be present to



receive the flock and will be awarded one (1) ewe lamb, one (1) yearling ewe, and one (1) brood ewe donated by members of the USTSA. Each animal will be a USTSA registered animal, and at least QR in Scrapie Codon 171 genotype. The winner will also receive a \$150 credit for use toward purchase of additional animals at the 2022 national sale. Applications, due April 1st, are now available http://www.ustargheesheep.org/ Any young person, ages 9-17, as of January 1, 2022, whose family does not raise Targhee sheep may apply.

2022 Starter Ewe Program

The Wisconsin Southdown Association is seeking applicants for the 2022 Starter Ewe program. The number of winners will be determined by the number of ewes donated in that year. Wisconsin youth ages 11-16 enrolled in 4-H or FFA who do

NAMES IN ACTION

TIME 10-30 minutes

THE GAME Ask players to introduce themselves to the group, one by one, by pairing each syllable of their name with a fun motion as they say their name out loud. (For example, Crystal has two syllables in her name, so she puts her hands on her hips when she says Crys and bobs her head with tal.) The group responds to each person by repeating the name with the same action to affirm the person and learn the name for themselves. As each new person introduces herself or himself, ask the group to also repeat each previous person's name and action.

VARIATION

After everyone has introduced themselves to the group, play a dance music compilation and call out names of group members at random. Everyone dances to the motions of each name as you call it out.
