There are two CD's, one has been renewed for another year and the other will be cashed in when it matures. Some grant funding was used this year, Banners were purchased and Speakers presented to the group on several occasions. Available grant funds for the Parade Float are being considered for use. Funds could be used to update the Waupaca County presentation booth at the Waupaca County Fair in 2024.

All project request received have been approved. A proposed budget was outlined for 2023. This will be provided to Members at the next meeting for review and approval.
