Extension Impact: Education Makes a Difference

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4-H Super Saturday Project Day

Waupaca County 4-H Super Saturday is the largest project training held during the 4-H year and is an excellent example of youth and adults working together in the 4 -H spirit. Both youth and adult volunteers taught over 35 classes. Close to 170 youth registered for Super Saturday. Tank and a committee of youth and adults work together to plan and coordinate the whole event. This includes determining the date and other logistics, brainstorming class ideas, contacting individuals to teach, handling the registration, getting supplies, setting up and helping the day of the event.

A spark is an area of interest or something that brings you joy. Through Super Saturday, members are encouraged to explore their sparks and maybe even discover a new spark! The planning committee discusses the variety of project



areas they would like to offer to reach as many different interests as possible. Some classes from this year included forestry, ice fishing, cake decorating, juggling, crafts, painting, animal classes, woodworking, homemade hand salve, and the Sheriff Department K-9 unit. Tank also teaches new volunteer leader training during Super

Saturday. A new addition this year was having the Manawa Rural Fire Department bring a fire truck during snack time for families to go out and visit.

Evaluations are being collected through a google form. Of those completed so far, on a scale of 1 to 5 (5 being very much), when asked if the participant was able to explore an area of interest (or a spark) during Super Saturday, the average score is a 4.7. When we asked what they found most valuable about Super Saturday, responses included "time spent together," "learning and trying things I wouldn't usually get to do," "Variety of classes for anyone's interests. Teachers were friendly and helpful," and "The hands-on sessions that were age appropriate."







Waupaca County Life Span & Financial Security Programming Updates

It has been an exciting few months of learning about Waupaca County residents' needs around aging and financial well-being, while also meeting with individual community members and partner organizations. In addition to delivering a virtual presentation on scam prevention for seniors, I was also able to participate in the Waupaca County Caregiver Coalition Resource Fair and promote our upcoming programming, as follows:

Planning Ahead

Planning Ahead is a course that helps guide participants in planning for the end of life for themselves and others, as well as for those who have lost a loved one and are dealing with the



accompanying transitions. This program is 7 sessions and will cover topics, such as handling financial changes, advance medical and legal directives, estate planning, choices in end-of-life care, final wishes, and understanding grief. We will be offering this program virtually at the following times: Tuesdays and Thursdays from 12 p.m.-1:30 p.m.--7/18, 7/20, 7/25, 7/27, 8/1, 8/3, and 8/8.

Aging Mastery

Aging Mastery is a 10-week program created by the National Council on Aging that covers topics, such as healthy living, nutrition, exercise, sleep, financial fitness, medication management, and more.

Rent Smart

Rent Smart is a 6-session program that focuses on helping renters to build their knowledge and skills to be a successful renter. This course is currently offered virtually across Wisconsin counties ongoing.

Extension Waupaca County Offers Dial Gauge Canner Testing

The Extension Waupaca County office is pleased to announce that Presto dial gauge canner testing is now available. This service is offered at no charge to members of the community.

Pressure canners manufactured by Presto, Maid of Honor, Magic Seal or National should be tested every year against a calibrated gauge to ensure that they are working properly. Pressure canning is the only way to safely can lowacid foods such as vegetables and meats, and the Waupaca County office offers this service to help home canners safely preserve the bounty of the harvest.

The University of Wisconsin-Madison Division of Extension takes great care to ensure that only trained staff administer this service. We are proud to announce

that our very own Amy Ebert and Haley Nelson have completed the required training and are ready to provide this valuable service to the community.

It is important to note that only dial gauge canners have to be checked every year, and it is not necessary to test weighted gauge canners. Even dial gauges that are brand new should be checked before they are used. Consumers may bring in the dial gauge or, preferably, the lid of the canner with the gauge attached.

Waupaca Children's Garden Program

FoodWIse was approached by two Master Gardeners with a proposal to move the children's garden program to the underutilized community garden located on the ThedaCare property. This idea was brought back to the Living the Waupaca Way coalition, managers of the garden, and they accepted this great idea. In the past, the Master Gardeners held a children's garden program at Swan Park and registration was offered through Park and Rec and the program had a cost.

After applying for a "Growing Together" garden grant, FoodWIse was granted funding to help generate sustainability for this program. With the funds, lumber, soil, seeds and plant starters will be purchase from local businesses.

This program will be offered to any families with children ages 1st grade to 5th grade this summer! FoodWIse is advertising and encouraging participation of this program to their target audience who have limited resources as it is **FREE** for all! Children will learn where their food comes from by planting, maintaining, and harvesting their own square-foot garden and take home the produce for their own use. There will also be designated garden beds planted for the children to experience giving back to their community and produce will be given to local t

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
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NEW 4-H Sponsored Plat Book Coming Summer 2023
