The Treasurer's report was provided by Rebecca Weber Schmoll and will be filed for audit. Two members have outstanding annual membership dues.

Committees and Events

2023 Summer Event Planning Decision to have a MGV Plant Sale on SUNDAY JUNE 4th, 2023 at Deana Hirte's Residence. This will be the same day as the Weyauwega Fireman's Chicken BBQ. Rebecca and Jean S. are the chairs of this committee. Members are encouraged to start thinking of plants that you can bring or neighbors who may have gardens that are in need of thinning. If there are plants left over from the plant sale, Doug suggested selling them during the Strawberry Fest held a few weeks later. REMINDER: This event will need "ALL HANDS ON DECK". Please add this to your calendar. A plant sale Newsletter went out to all members and will be sent again in May with any updates. Members are asked to send a list of plants or plant types they are planning to donate to Rebecca or Jean by April 30th or as soon as possible. Signup sheets are available and were circulated during the meeting. Members are encouraged to get in touch and sign up for hours. Plants need to be dug at the Missions of Hope garden, volunteers are welcome to help. Pots and stakes (blinds) for labels were available and will also be on hand during the May meeting. Plant sale flyers are printed and will be distributed for placement in the surrounding communities. Please be sure plants are identified correctly and labeled appropriately. The MG Plant Sale was posted on Facebook; like the post and invite others to join you. Promotional options were discussed.

If possible, please send the plant type(s) and number of plants to Rebecca or Jean by April 30th.

We will have some plants available to dig at the Mission of Hope House in New London. Volunteers who would like to help dig and pot plants for the sale should contact Jean.

We will have pots, labels, and cut blinds available at the May meeting. If you have your own pots, please be sure they are regular plain plant pots for potting (no printing on them). If you have questions on anything regarding plants, potting, labeling, or need help with digging plants, etc., just give one of us a call or email. We would love to hear from you!

Additional pots and labels will be made available. Please let us know if you would be willing to keep a supply at your house for pickup by other W.M.G.V. members.

An electronic version of the labels has already been sent by Nancy. Please let us knows if you need it sent again.

P.S. Jumping worms. . . be on the lookout for these critters as you are digging. If you find any, please do not bring plants to the sale in order to prevent spreading. Visit the DNR website for more info: https://dnr.wi.gov/topic/Invasives/fact/jumpingWorm/index.html. <u>Jumping worms | Amynthas spp. | Wisconsin DNR</u>

All plants brought to the plant sale must be identified to include:

- o Common name
- o Botanical (Latin) name
- Sunlight requirements
- Blooming time
- Bloom color
- Whether it's an annual, biennial or perennial
- Your MGV ID number

If you can't identify it, it may be on this "Don't Bring" list, so don't bring it. This is especially important!
