56-Years

Pat Ritchie

Pat was the General Leader for the Hobart 4-H Club until it disbanded. Since that time she has been the Waupaca County 4-H Plant and Soil Science Key Leader. When Pat was a club leader, she was the leader for several projects and activities. Pat has served on the Leaders' Board in several capacities, as well as the State 4-H Leaders Council and the 4-H Foundation Board. She has served on many county committees over the years. Pat is the Superintendent for the Jr. Fair Plant and Soil Science committee and the Open Class House Plants and Flowers at the county fair. She is on the State 4-H Plant and Soil Science committee and has helped with the planning and implementation of the State Plant and Soil Sciences day held each summer. She has also helped to plan and worked at the booth for the plant and soil committee for Farm Technology days. Pat is a certified judge in plant and soil science, houseplant and flowers, and exploring.


