#### **COUNTY NEWS**

#### Changing and adding project areas

Members are able to change projects they enroll in until April 1, 2024 if a project area is forgotten or you want to add or delete after the November 15 re-enrollment deadline. The project areas you are enrolled in are the areas where members will be able to enter exhibits in the junior fair next summer. Contact Penny at penny.tank@wisc.edu to make any changes for you. After April 1, no project areas can be added or changed.

#### New Enrollments

New Enrollments will be accepted at any time of the year; HOWEVER, in order to participate in the 2024 Waupaca County Junior Fair as a 4-H member, enrollments need to be completed by February 1, 2024.

#### **County Programming Support**

The Leaders' Association supports numerous educational efforts for Waupaca County 4-H members and leaders. These include summer camp, project workshops, Day Camp, educational experiences, literature for club libraries, accident insurance, and much more. Due to the costs to support these efforts, the 4-H Leaders' Board/Association asks for a donation of \$6.00 per member and \$2 per leader when you enroll in the program annually. This is collected at the club level and one check is sent to the 4-H Leaders' Board.


#### Super Saturday Teachers Wanted



The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Celebrates the Arts Art Contest is open to any current Wisconsin 4-H member, with cash prizes totaling nearly \$1,000. The contest will be held virtually, with photos of all entries submitted electronically. Entries are being accepted now through January 15, 2024.

The contest is broken into eight categories:

1. Drawing Using Any Medium

- 2. Painting (acrylic, watercolor or oil)
- 3. Pottery, Ceramics or Clay
- 4. Photography
- 5. Paper
- 6. Fabric, Yarn or Fiber
- 7. Any Other Media (ex: digital, metalcraft, jewelry, leatherwork, wax, eggshells, taxidermy, etc.)
- 8. 4-H Art—non-photography
- 9. 4-H Art –photography

#### **Educational Experience Scholarship Opportunity**

The Waupaca County 4-H Leaders' Association has money budgeted to help offset the cost of educational experiences for 4-H members. Due to the inability to travel for the last few years, youth may have the opportunity to receive financial support for more than one experience depending on a variety of factors.




#### Citizenship Washington Focus (CWF)

Citizenship Washington Focus, or CWF for short, is the premier week long 4-H citizenship and leadership experience. This years week of travel is June 15-22 and this experience is for youth in grades 10-12. CWF brings 4-H delegations from all over the country to stay in Washington D.C., our Nation's Capital!



Participants learn about the roles of Senators and Representatives in the United States' government and how these parts work together to form an effective Congress. Additionally. youth get to see and experience government in action. Delegates also participate in various educational workshops.

#### <u>Club / Group Charters—Thank You</u>

As we continue another 4-H year, I want to remind everyone of the financial guidelines.

- Regardless of the source, all 4-H funds are public funds
- Keep receipts and copies of any bills! You should only be • paying for things when there are receipts and/or utilize payment vouchers as needed.
- Do not keep "petty cash" or "cash boxes" with money on • hand. Run all money through an approved account. This gives you a trail of deposits and payments.
- Put all income and expenses into categories as you incur them or pay them. This will help in filling out the financial reports.
- Budgets help clubs and groups plan. If your club would like help creating a budget please contact the Extension office.
- Club fundraisers should be conducted to reach a certain goal; there should be a plan and reason for raising a certain amount of money.

If you have any questions, do not hesitate to contact me.

#### 4-H Emblem Use

Many clubs make posters to promote 4-H, banners, order t-shirts for their club, and do other promotion efforts in each community. These are great opportunities for the program. There are guidelines for proper use of the name and emblem. The 4-H name and emblem belong to the 4-H Youth Development Program, under the authority of USDA and anyone wishing to use it must obtain permission.
