2023 Winter Wear Distribution (Hats, Mittens and Scarf Sets)

Each year, Waupaca County HCE partners with Oshkosh Correctional Institution to make sure our youngsters in Waupaca County have warm hats, mittens and scarves to play safely and enjoy the winter weather. HCE Community

Outreach chair, Myrtle Kutchenriter collects yarn and fleece donations on behalf of this ambitious project. HCE has

partnered on this project for the past 23 years, leading the effort for the last 20 years. We deliver the yarn several times throughout the year and in October we



return to get the completed winterwear sets from the volunteer knitters and crocheters at the prison. This year we received 200 sets, added another 50 sets that Myrtle and her daughter made from fleece and met our goal. Here is where this year's hats, mittens and scarves went:

Clintonville Headstart (50 Fleece sets) New London Headstart (50 knit sets) Manawa Food Pantry (25 knit sets) Manawa Grade School (25 Knit sets)

New London UCC Church and Angel Tree (25 sets) Waupaca County Health Department (25 sets)

During COVID, Creative and Caring Hands from the Waupaca Area teamed up with Waupaca County HCE to provide addition items for community distribution. This year this donation included:

Emmanuel Lutheran Church Angel Tree (26 hats and 11 fleece scarves)

Clintonville and Marion Meals on Wheels (20 lap blankets and carry bags)

Comfort Kits of soft animals, stuffed toys, small blankets in a carry bag for the police departments of Manawa, Marion, Clintonville, New London, Iola, Weyauwega and Waupaca (10 kits per department). Now that gives a warm feeling to all of us.

Bee-utiful Treats - Cooking with Honey

The November study lesson featured honey; including tricks to switch honey for other sweeteners in baking, cooking, freezing fruit or making jam. We taste tested several recipes to round out the program.

Some Amazing Bee Facts

- Honey Bees Can Fly Up to 6 Miles in Search of Nectar
- Nectar from 2 Million Flowers is Needed to Make 1 Pound of Honey
- Honey Bees Beat Their Wings 200 Times per Second
- Female Honey Bees Have Stingers
- One Bee will Produce 1/12 of a Teaspoon of Honey in its Lifetime
- Honey Never Spoils
- World Bee Day is May 20th
- Like Bees "Work Hard and Stay Bumble"



Honey Substitution Rules

- Reduce liquid when substituting honey
 - 1/4 cup less liquid if substituting half the sugar for honey
 - 1/2 cup less liquid if substituting all honey
- 2. Combine honey and liquid before blending into recipe
- 3. Reduce oven temperature by 25 degrees
- 4. Honey is an equal substitute for Molasses
- 5. Add 1/3 to 1/2 teaspoon baking soda if substituting honey
- 6. Add an extra dash of salt
- 7. Measure honey carefully

Honey is an equal measure substitute in:

Puddings and Custards
Pie Fillings
Candied and sweet or
Sour Vegetables
Salad Dressing
Baked Apples
Cinnamon, Raison and
Yeast Bread or Muffins



What if Honey Crystalizes?

Cloudy honey is more likely to crystalize Cloudiness is often pollen Place honey container in pan of warm water, away from direct heat. Honey will reblend as it warms.


