

Myrtle I. Kutchenriter, age 84 of the Town of Union, Waupaca County passed away, February 5, 2024, at her daughter's home in New London, where she had been living since mid -December due to declining health.

Myrtle was born on May 25, 1939 as the daughter of the late William and Dorothy Trettin. Only a week after her birth, her father William passed away and her mother married Raymond Burmeister, who helped to raise Myrtle throughout her life. Myrtle graduated from Shiocton High School in 1957, and on August 29, 1959 was united in marriage to Louis Kutchenriter at Christus Lutheran Church in Clintonville. The couple remained members at Christus, where Myrtle was active with the Worship Committee, Altar Guild, helped with money counting, quilting, communion serving, and also volunteered with the C.L.C.W. Aside from helping Louis with the daily farm chores, Myrtle spent over 47 years working as an accountant at FWD Seagrave in Clintonville.

Myrtle was also active in her community with Waupaca

County Home and Community Education for over 50 years, volunteering with 4-H for 48 years, Meals on Wheels, and Ruby's Pantry. Myrtle took her role as Coordinator of Family and Community Outreach very serious. She led the effort to work with Oshkosh Correctional Institution to donate yarn and receive knit hats, mittens and scarves for the HCE Winterwear Project, sewing hundreds of additional fleece sets to meet the demand. Myrtle enjoyed entering the local and state Cultural Arts Shows and attended as many of the WAHCE state conferences as she was able.

Myrtle and Louis enjoyed traveling with "Have Group Will Travel" and attending shows at the Fireside Theater in Fort Atkinson. Myrtle enjoyed all arts and crafts; especially basket weaving, quilting, sewing, knitting, and crocheting. She was always on the go, but is now home with her Lord and husband Louis.

ALL items, including Bonus Category, must be pre-registered. Registration is due August 1, 2024. Any items NOT pre-registered will NOT be judged or displayed. Only one (1) entry on each registration form. Send all forms together immediately after the county show including written entries. A County may enter a total of 12 entries, plus one Bonus Category 20. A County cannot have duplicate entries in any lettered sub-category. The County Cultural Arts Chair must include a self-addressed postcard or email address to verify receipt of registration forms. If you do not receive verification within three (3) weeks, please call or email the WAHCE Cultural Arts Chair.

IMPORTANT: ALL entrants MUST sign the registration form. Please read and sign below. Entries will NOT be accepted if unsigned. Entrants will not hold WAHCE responsible for any loss or damage to any item submitted for use in the WAHCE Cultural Arts Show. Entrants give permission for their photo, photos of their entry, and/or print copies of their written entry to be used by WAHCE as seen fit. Judges have authority to put items in the proper category, if needed.

All work must be done by the entrant and completed after last year's county show. It must receive first place at the current year's county show or fair. All items must be clean or laundered or will be disqualified by the judge. Kits and patterns may be used if the entrant does all the work. All easels must have a securely taped label with name, county, and district.

#### Painting (1A,1B,1C,1D,1E):

Artwork Must be framed or canvas wrapped.

#### Drawing (2A,2B,2C):

Artwork Must be framed or wrapped. Please spray charcoal or pencil drawings with fixative to avoid rubbing off onto other artwork.

#### Photography (3A,3B,3C,3D,3E,3F,3G):

Size Requirement: Must be an 8" x 10" print. (Unmatted and Unframed and placed in an 8 ½" x 11" sheet protector.)

 Craft (4A and 4B only): Up to 6 cards without envelopes must be mounted as a group on a flat, sturdy display board.

Size Requirement: No larger than 14" x 22".

#### 6. Poem (6)

The writer must have Two Copies typed (12 pt font) which must accompany the registration form.

Entries must NOT be framed or in book form.

Staple a cover sheet with the category/title which is to be centered on the page.

The name and county should appear on the back side of the entry.

#### Prose (7A.7B, 7C):

(7A): This Must be an original Non-Fiction piece of writing written or published in the current year. (Aug 2023 to Aug 2024)

Written piece must be 3000 words or less.

The writer must have Two Copies typed (12-point font) which must accompany the registration form.

Entries must NOT be framed or in book form.

Staple a cover sheet with the category/title which is to be centered on the page.

The name and county should appear on the back side of the entry.

(7B): This must be an original Fiction Short Story which has a beginning, middle, and end.

Piece will need to be written or published in the current year. (Aug 2023 to Aug 2024)

Written piece must be 3000 words or less.

The writer must have two copies typed (12-point font) which must accompany the registration form.

Entries must NOT be framed or in book form.

Staple a cover sheet with the category/title which is to be centered on the page.

The name and county should appear on the back side of the entry.

#### (7C): Other

This must be original piece of writing written and/or published in the current year (Aug 2023 to Aug 2024)

Written piece must be 3000 words or less.

The writer must have two copies typed (12 pt font) which must accompany the registration form.

Entries must NOT be framed or in book form.

Staple a cover sheet with the category/title which is to be centered on the page. The name and county should appear on the back side of the entry.

#### 8. Original Published Book (8):

Copy of Book must Accompany the Entry Book must have been published in the current year. (8/2023 to 8/2024)

#### 16. Bed Quilt (16A.16B,16C,16D,16E,16F):

<u>Size Requirement</u>: Must be Larger than 60" x 80" (4800 Square Inches) Measurement must be written on entry form and be confirmed by County Cultural Arts Chair.

A 4x6 picture is required for this category. (The picture must be placed inside of a plastic bag along with the entry form and then attached to the right, bottom corner of quilt with a safety pin)

#### Small Quilt (17A,17B,17C,17D,17E,17F,17G):

<u>Size Requirement:</u> Smaller than 60" x 80" (4800 Square Inches) Measurement must be written on entry form and be confirmed by County Cultural Arts Chair.

A 4x6 Picture is required for this category. (The picture must be placed inside of a plastic bag along with the entry form and then attached to the right, bottom corner of the quilt with a safety pin)

#### 18. Quilted Wall Hanging (18A,18B,18C):

<u>Size Requirement</u>: Must be no Larger than 50" square.

One Item only allowed. Must be submitted WITHOUT frames.

#### 20. Bonus Category (20):

Bonus Category Theme: "The Magic of HCE" Directions: This

category is open to the artist's interpretation. Artists are encouraged to collect ideas from fellow club members. People can use any medium to create their one-of-a-kind pieces. Only one entry per county can be chosen to enter at the state level. This category will be judged on originality and how unique and creative the concept is along with how well it has been crafted and designed.

<u>Size Restrictions</u>: 10"L x 10"W x 20"H. Sizes must be measured by the County Cultural Arts Chair and then written on each entry before it will be judged at the state level.
