Session 1 (8:40 – 9:40 a.m.)

- 1A. **4-H Open Forum** no need to register for this session an opportunity for parents to ask questions about 4-H, leaders could complete Supporting You, Supporting Youth or Building Safe Spaces training together on a laptop during this time as well. Instructor: Penny Tank
- 1B. **Woodworking-** (*repeated in session 2*) Build a wren bird house. Please bring a (labeled) hammer and Phillips screwdriver. Class size limit of 12. Class open to all; adult asked to stay with younger members. Instructors: David & Delores Bork
- 1C. **Poultry: Raising a Quality Bird** (*repeated in session 2*) Learn about what it takes to raise and show poultry. This class counts for small market educational point. Maximum class size of 15, open to grades 3 and up. Instructor: Isabelle Dietzler

- 1M. **Turkey Calling** Learn about turkey calling and other outdoor information. Open to any age. Class size limit of 15. Instructor: Larry Shofner
- 1N. **Pour Painting** (*repeated in session 2*) Great class for all ages. Learn the technique of pour painting, aka, fluid art. Class size limit of 15. Instructors: Miranda Janec, Emily & Alaina Gabrielson
- 10. **Memo Sign Board** (*repeated in session 2*) Using a pizza pan, youth will create a decorative sign board along with fun wood magnets to match. Open to any age, class size limit of 10. Please have an adult or older youth stay to assist younger youth. Instructor: Janet Wiechert
