From the Wisconsin Extension Master Gardener Program - April Newsletter Have you logged into the ORS for 2024 yet?

Before you start your participation in the Wisconsin Extension Master Gardener program each year you will need to login to the Online Reporting System (ORS) and Acknowledge the Terms Acceptance and Profile Update.

Reminder: Participation cards can be printed from your dashboard after completion. Log In by May 1 for Name Badges

Name badges will be issued to all current participants in the program (who did not receive one in 2023).

What we need you to do to receive a name badge:

Acknowledge the Terms Acceptance and Profile Update in the Online Reporting System (ORS) on or before May 1, 2024.

Verify your contact information in the ORS. The name badge will be mailed to the address on file in the ORS.

Enter Your Preferred or Chosen First Name. This will be used on the name badge. Last names will not be used in order to protect your privacy and safety.

You will only receive one name badge. No replacements will be issued.

If you completed the 2023 Terms Acceptance between May 15 and Dec 31 2023, you are slated to receive in the 2024 distribution.

You are expected to discontinue use of all old name badges when conducting volunteer activities or obtaining continuing education related to your participation in the Wisconsin Extension Master Gardener Program.

The 2024 scholarship forms have been sent to each High School within the county. Scholarship due date is this Wednesday, May 1st. We have received a couple of applications so far.

April 11, 2024 Meeting Notes

Waupaca County Court House - Lower Meeting Room

The meeting was called to order by Co-President Jean Skewes at 7:30pm with 11 members and 4 guests present.

Secretary's report was given by Jean and Carrie. The March Meeting minutes were approved by Nancy and Connie.

Jean Skewes provided the Treasurers report. Rebecca has filed this for audit. Plant Sale weekend update: June 1st and 2nd activities were discussed. The Committee is led by Jean and Rebecca. Plans are set to the following: Saturday, June 1st from 8:00am to 5:00pm – Plant Intake and Sunday, June 2nd – Plant Sale: Volunteers arrive at 7:30am.

The plant sale starts at 8:00 am and runs until close; with clean up ending around 3:00pm (or until cleanup is done).

Communication is critical to make this a successful event. Volunteers will need to sign up for work hours for this event in April. Carrie will be sending out more information on this. Please contact Rebecca, Jean or Carrie to sign up for volunteer hours at the plant sale.

We have set a May deadline to complete planning. Members will be prompted to send in their estimated plant list by the next meeting. This will include a list of plant to bring and not to bring. With low membership numbers, everyone needs to be involved in the sale and providing enough plants to sell. Other neighboring counties have plant sales. Some are buying all of the plants to resell due to Jumping Worms. Please be on the lookout for these when digging plants.

At the May meeting we plant to revisit posters distribution in local community boards and where banners will be placed for publicity. There will be pots, labeling material (slats) and tags available for members to use for plants being donated. All plants need to be in non-marked pot and identified with a tag/label (common name, botanical (Latin name), sunlight requirements, blooming time, bloom color, zone information (annual, biannual or perennial), and the MGV member ID number.

Membership:

There were 10 interested guests in attendance. One of them already completed the training (online)! Membership training reimbursement was mentioned during the visitor portion of tonight's meeting. This will need additional discussion as cost and options to complete the training have changed. We may be able to cover a portion of the training, but it would be contingent on the member being active for at least one year. The support from the UW Ext. has shifted with fewer resources in the county. (Note: Check to see what members in 2019 were reimbursed for training.)

Spring/Summer Meeting Locations: 6 options were listed on the Agenda.

Of those six, the members discussed and chose locations to schedule for the upcoming months.

May: Bees & Blooms, New London (Joan)

June: Iris Farm, Saxeville (Carrie) or Chain 'o Lakes (Silver Mist) (Patty) August: Rebecca's Home

Joan mentioned there is a very nice plant sale at the Paine Art Center the Saturday before mother's day.

Onboarding Lite: Can we coordinate a time to do this as a group? In the April UW MGV Program newsletter there was a posting about this. The due date to log in and complete onboarding light is May 1st. There are no quizzes to complete. Joan may contact the Ext. Office (Amy) to see if any assistance is available.
