<u>Record Book Pages</u>

For members, record books are a valuable part of the 4-H experience. They are intended to help you

develop lifelong skills such as:

- \Rightarrow Setting goals
- \Rightarrow Planning and organizing
- \Rightarrow Communicating in writing
- \Rightarrow Evaluating effort and progress



Once completed, members experience personal satisfaction from completing a worthwhile task.

You also have a valuable record of accomplishments that can be used when applying for awards, scholarships, college or a job! Remember to begin saving information for your record books throughout the year and to start filling out the record book pages early. Refer to the guidelines you receive with the record book pages for details about completing your record book.

Similar to last year, **printed copies of record book pages will be given to those that want them**. We will not be printing and handing out record book pages to all members as in the past unless requested through your club leader or the extension office. On this website there is a powerpoint that you can look at for tips and sample record book pages/project story examples. More detail about awards and recognition for record books will be included in a future Forecast newsletter. Completed record books are due to your club general leader in mid-September.

4-H Projects vs. County Fair Exhibits

What's the difference between 4-H projects and fair exhibits? A 4-H "Project" is an area of interest you want to learn more about (like a hobby). This is what you sign-up for during enrollment in 4-HOnline (i.e. horse, electricity, dogs, photography, etc.). A project is intended to help you explore, learn, and practice skills in your areas of interest. Youth must choose their projects at the time of enrollment so they have plenty of time to learn about or practice with their project area before the fair.

A **County Fair "Exhibit"** is what you actually take to the fair – like the cabbage you grew, the animal you trained, or the rocket you built while exploring and learning about your projects. There may be some things you do while exploring your project area that you do not take to the fair as exhibits and that is ok. Youth sign up to exhibit at the County Fair during June/early July based on the exhibits and rules listed in the Waupaca County Fair Premium book.

2025 Waupaca County Fairest of the Fair Applications Available

The Waupaca County Fair is seeking candidates for the position of the 2025 Waupaca County Fairest of the Fair! Applications must be submitted by Thursday, May 15, 2025. Applicants must be 18 years of age to apply. The selection process will include each, a written application, individual and group interviews, on-stage interview questions, and interactions with the judges during the Fairest of the Fair Competition in June. Attendance is mandatory for the competition with a finalized date being shared with all applicants.

The Waupaca County Fairest of the Fair serves as the official ambassador of the Waupaca County Fair, representing and promoting the Fair at events across the county throughout the year. The Fairest also makes daily appearances during the week

of the Fair and will be responsible for speeches, other community interactions and promotional events.

<u>Area Animal Science Days</u>

June 30 in Calumet County. Area Animal Science Day is a daylong event where youth in the beef, dairy, horse, sheep, and swine projects increase their decision-making skills and knowledge of animals through judging and grading experiences. Events include evaluation of dairy cattle, horses, and meat animals; dairy showmanship contests; and oral reasons workshops. <u>Baldwins Mill</u>– Easter cards were made by club members for nursing home residents. The club also planned to go bowling and have an egg hunt.


<u>Dayton Community</u>– The club participated in a weaving project and are busy making plans for future club projects.


