#### 2025 Waupaca County Fair

The exhibit entry system is ready to go and each family received an email on June 9 with the details. Fair entries are due JULY 1<sup>st</sup> Exhibit questions should go to the Waupaca County Fair Exhibitor Coordinator at wcfexhibitorcoordinator@gmail.com. #### **4-H Food Stand Supervisors Needed**

The Waupaca County 4-H Leaders' Board is looking for individuals willing to serve as supervisors in the 4-H Food Stand to oversee the running of the food stand during the week of the Waupaca County Fair. The number of hours to work will depend on the number of supervisors and can be divided by up to 4 or 5 people for the week of fair. Supervisors will receive an honorarium from the Leaders' Board (up to \$600 divided between the number of supervisors and hours worked).

#### A summary of the services the supervisors will perform includes:

- a. Availability to work multiple shifts during the week of the County Fair (a schedule will be confirmed between all supervisors)
- b. Participate in orientation and training prior to the fair regarding food stand licensing requirements, operation, covid guidelines, and practices for working with 4-H youth and adult volunteers.
- c. Ensure the food stand is in compliance with license standards and that workers are following food safety, sanitation, cleaning, and other guidelines that may be in effect.
- d. Check inventory daily during the fair.
- e. Assist with proper running of food stand equipment.
- f. Oversee the worker schedule and orient youth and adults as they come to work in the stand.
- g. Communicate with the other supervisors, the Leaders' Board and other Food Stand volunteers
- h. Coordinate opening and closing of the stand each day depending on your scheduled hours

The need for these contracted supervisor positions is really during the week of the fair. Other responsibilities like initially ordering food for the stand, prep and clean up of the stand and equipment, and other pre and post fair duties are able to be covered by other volunteers. #### Waupaca County 4-H Graduates

We are interested in highlighting the accomplishments of Waupaca County 4-H graduates. Members can graduate from 4-H the same year they graduate from high school or they can choose to stay in one year after high school graduation. Some graduates have already been highlighted. Youth in grades 12 & 13 will receive a reminder email in the next few weeks and will be asked to complete a google form about your experience in 4-H. We will put these together to post on Facebook.

#### **Record Book Pages**

For members, record books are a valuable part of the 4-H experience. They are intended to help you develop lifelong skills such as:

Setting goals – Planning and organizing – Communicating in writing Evaluating effort and progress

Once completed, members experience personal satisfaction from completing a worthwhile task.

You also have a valuable record of accomplishments that can be used when applying for awards, scholarships, college or a job! Remember to begin saving information for your record books throughout the year and to start filling out the record book pages early. Refer to the guidelines you receive with the record book pages for details about completing your record book.

Similar to last year, printed copies of record book pages will be given to those that want them. Some club leaders have already requested pages. 
# **VOLUNTEER LEADER NEWS**

#### **Volunteer Policy Reminders**

With summer, here are a few reminders of statewide 4-H policies that may impact activities your clubs or groups plan. This web link includes more information about each of these items.

- The minimum standard for adult to minor supervision ratio is 1 approved adult volunteer for every 10 youth (more adults is better)
- Rule of 3—There must be at least two authorized adults and one minor, or one authorized adult and two minors, present for all programs unless the situation qualifies for or is approved for an exception.
- Transportation—Transportation to and from Extension activities is the responsibility of the participant and/or their parents/guardians.
   Individuals who choose to carpool to/from Extension programs assume any and all associated risks.
- Driver authorization for volunteers (for example, driving in a parade) In situations where transportation for youth is provided as part of the
   Extension program, authorized adults who are 21 years of age or older
   and are approved to drive as part of their roles must complete the UW Madison Driver Authorization.
- Parade policy—https://4h.extension.wisc.edu/files/2020/10/4-H-Members-Participating-in-Parades-FINAL.pdf
- Swimming—Lifeguards are required when youth are participating in swimming-related 4-H activities.
- Bus rental—buses are an excellent alternative for club or group trips where multiple families are attending. If your club or group is looking at securing a bus, contact Penny at the Extension office to work through the contract, volunteers cannot sign contracts such as this due to liability

#### **National 4-H Congress**

November 28-December 2, 2025; Atlanta, GA—Open to youth currently enrolled in Grades 9-12 (grades 10-13 for the 2025-26 4-H year).

Registration is open in 4-H Online until June 30th.

National 4-H Congress is a five-day Educational Experience held in Atlanta, GA. Congress is the premiere nation-wide event for 4-Hers to network with others from around the United States, Canada, and Puerto Rico. While at Congress, 4-Hers engage in leadership, citizenship, global awareness, and inclusion. Highlights include educational workshops, exploring the city, international events, community service, educational tours, and the National Congress Gala. The Waupaca County 4-H Leaders' Association offers scholarships up to half of the cost with an application and interview. After you register, you will receive scholarship details and

#### State 4-H Horse Expo Entries


For any horse project members interested in showing at the State 4-H Horse Expo and/or the State 4-H Gymkhana Show in September, entry forms need to be COMPLETE and submitted to Penny Tank at the Extension Office by July 8th with checks, coggins, or whatever else is needed. This way I have time to sign and get any questions answered if needed. Entries need to be postmarked by August 1 and need to be submitted as a county.

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#### Calling all 4-H Members and Parents for the Food Stand

Plans are underway for the 4-H Food Stand at the County Fair!! Watch for more information to come out soon and volunteer to work a few hours and help the county 4-H program raise funds to continue to offer the great opportunities all year. Sign up will take place again this year through sign up genius.

#### 4-H Projects vs. County Fair Exhibits

What's the difference between 4-H projects and fair exhibits? A 4-H "Project" is an area of interest you want to learn more about (like a hobby) throughout the whole year. This is what you sign-up for during enrollment in 4-HOnline (i.e. horse, electricity, dogs, photography, etc.). A project is intended to help you explore, learn, and practice skills in your areas of interest. Youth must choose their projects at the time of enrollment so they have plenty of time to learn about or practice with their project area before the fair.

A **County Fair "Exhibit"** is what you actually take to the fair – like the cabbage you grew, the animal you trained, or the rocket you built while exploring and learning about your projects. There may be some things you do while exploring your project area that you do not take to the fair as exhibits and that is ok. Youth sign up to exhibit at the County Fair during June based on the exhibits and rules listed in the Waupaca County Fair Premium book.

#### Last Year Judges Favorite Award

If you received a Judges Favorite Award at the 2024 Waupaca County Fair, you are eligible to enter your exhibit in the 2025 Wisconsin State Fair.
